In seeking to meet our commitment Boral will:

- Develop and maintain a structured health and safety management system with common global group standards to provide a framework for effective hazard identification and risk management.
- Work to eliminate hazards that could cause incidents, injuries and illnesses.
- Clearly define health, safety and wellbeing responsibilities for leaders, employees and contractors.
- Incorporate health and safety into the business planning cycle so that objectives can be set, plans formulated and performance measures identified.
- Act to ensure that employees and contractors have the necessary skills and knowledge to worksafely and to contribute to ongoing improvements in safety performance.
- Seeking employee and contractor participation in identifying, assessing and controlling workplace hazards and in reviewing health and safety performance.
- Provide an injury management system for injured or ill workers that will facilitate their optimal recovery combined with a safe, supported return to sustainable work.
- Work with our customers and suppliers to improve health and safety outcomes for shared benefit.
- Comply with all applicable health and safety laws, as a minimum.
- Allocate sufficient resources to meet the commitments of this policy.

This policy is delivered through the implementation of Boral's integrated Health Safety Environment and Quality (HSEQ) Management System and related strategies, improvement plans and programs.
