Quarry hours

Our approved quarry operational hours are 6am-6pm Monday to Saturday. We are open for sales and production from 6am-4pm Monday to Friday and 6am-12pm on Saturday.

Concrete operations

Montrose's site is home to a concrete batching plant which provides concrete for local projects including Angliss Hospital's upgrade, the Eastern Freeway's expansions, West Urban Homes and Warburton's new Aldi. The plant operates Monday to Saturday from 6am-4pm. Our concrete team employs four full time employees and we have 14 maxis and 2 minis based at Montrose concrete plant.

Asphalt operations

The Montrose quarry precinct includes an asphalt plant which has been on the site since the 1960s.

This facility manufactures and supplies quality asphalt which is used by local contractors for the construction and maintenance of roads, car parks and driveways and employs eight full time staff. We have been working closely with the Environmental Protection Authority (EPA). We have recently added a new extraction system to reduce odour and improve air quality and we welcome any feedback you have via the QR code on the next page.

Dust management

Boral understands that dust from our operations may impact residents and we always seek to improve our operations with the help of feedback. Recent improvements will include increasing the number of real time dust monitors to help us better understand dust and monitor weather conditions. We have also increased the number of water sprays at the site and are trialling a fogger to reduce dust emissions.

Montrose fires

We were deeply saddened by the devastation caused by the recent fires in Montrose. Our hearts go out to everyone affected—those who have lost homes, livelihoods, and the sense of safety we all deserve. In this time of hardship, please know that you are not alone. We stand with you and are committed to supporting our community needs.

This event has highlighted the importance of vegetation management. We manage our land through a vegetation management plan which includes conducting regular trimming, pruning, and clearing of dry or overgrown vegetation which decreases the flammable material available. Although our site wasn't greatly impacted, we were able to provide access to the Country Fire Authority (CFA), so that they could fight the fire from a place that provided them with a vantage point.

As a result you may start to hear and feel blasting due to it being conducted closer to your property between 10am-4pm particularly for the residents in or near the Ashgrove area.
