## **Progress of Operations**

Brodie Bolton provided an update on operational activity since the last meeting. The main points of interest were:

- The approval of MOD 9 has allowed the site to begin preparation works for the new Croome West pit.
- Vegetation stripping and noise bund construction is progressing in the Croome West area.
- The new noise bund around Croome West pit is nearing completion. The bund will be hydro-seeded and planted with tress once final trim is completed and the bund is stable.
- The upgrade to the rail line onsite has been successfully completed.
- The site is updating many of the onsite Management Plans following the approval of MOD 9.
- The dust stockpile has been relocated to the RIC Slot from the Level Two stockpile area, providing better protection from westerly winds.
- The site underwent an inspection by the Mines Department. Results were good and a testament to the work of the staff onsite who maintain the 20-year-old plant.
- Work has begun (and will continue) on repairing/replacing barn and roller doors on the plant.
- Production continues predominantly in Croome South.
- The site has invested in a drone and will use the new technology for stockpile assessments and training purposes.
- The site confirmed with JET-GO, now operating from the Illawarra Airport, that the two business' operations will not impact each other.

## **Environmental Management and Monitoring**

Rod Johnson provided an update on environmental monitoring results since the last meeting. Points of interest included:

- *Environmental Monitoring*
  - Deposited dust, PM10 and blasting parameter monitoring results were

detailed. Trends in the dust data were discussed, with some results indicating a slight upward trend, mostly attributed to the hot, dry summer months.

- An onsite dust monitor will be re-located in the coming months due to the expansion of the Croome West pit.
- Blast monitoring locations will change due to the expansion of the Croome West pit, with monitoring continuing at the McParland residence. However, a new monitoring location is now in place at the Benny property.
- One community complaint was recorded for the period. It was noted that residents on Croome Vale Road raised concerns about dust from the noise bund under construction around the Croome West pit. Site to provide detail to members regarding the timing of the hydro-seeding of this bund.

Three comments were raised.

- A couple of blasts have seemed louder than previously. BB commented that due to blasting activities in the Croome Farm pit being conducted on higher benches, they could seem to be louder.
- Dust from the new Croome West bund is an issue. BB said the plan is to hydro-seed and plant out this bund. The delay has been due to finalising the bund and having it at final trim and stable before the planting occurs. BB to provide an update regarding the timing of the hydro-seeding to members.
- TM commented that the historic vibration he has felt seems to be much better, and thanked Boral management and staff for their efforts. TM also commented that the overall dust emissions from the site seem to have improved over the years.

## Planning and Development

Kate Jackson provided an update on planning and development matters associated with the quarry. The main topics were:

- Summary of quarry approvals was listed.
- An update on the Croome West pit was provided.
- A presentation on the Sydney Trains proposal was provided - Sydney Trains intends to gain approval to quarry the land it owns in the middle of the Boral Dunmore Quarry site.
- Kate also spoke of the large number of development applications currently under assessment in the Dunmore area.

The following comments were made.

- TM said that he had been approached by Sydney Trains about their proposal to quarry their land. An information sheet was provided to TM (and also MS) by Sydney Trains. No other CCC member had received this information.
