Operations review






Quarry development: basalt pit

We are currently looking at reshaping the northern wall of the basalt pit to create a new north 'ramp', allowing us to extract the existing central ramp.






THIS SECTION IS WELL UNDERWAY

- > The primary wall upgrade will commence in March-April 2023
- > We have sponsored the lions club special needs children Christmas show
- > Teven Quarry is now a non smoking site
- > New P10 dust monitor installed it took a 3 months to get

Average Dust Deposition (Insoluble Solids)

Site 1	0.73 g/m ²
Site 2	0.90 g/m ²
Site 3	3.05 g/m ²
Site 4	1.15 g/m ²

As of February 2015 the Environmental Analysis Laboratory (EAL) at Southern Cross University has been collecting and analysing the Deposited Dust sample bottles at the Boral Teven Quarry




Annual Average Dust Deposition (Insoluble Solids) 0.73 g / m² / month






Annual Average Dust Deposition (Insoluble Solids) 0.90 g / m² / month





Annual Average Dust Deposition (Insoluble Solids) 3.05 g / m² / month






Annual Average Dust Deposition (Insoluble Solids) 1.15 g / m² / month




Environmental monitoring – Blast Overpressure






Environmental monitoring – Blast Vibration

Environmental monitoring – Weed Management

Weed management

- Engaged Melaleuca Group to undertake a Weed Management Plan for the site
- Main focus areas along property boundary and top of Hill
- Re-establish Vegetation Corridor along Eastern Boundary of property
- Remove weed species from top of Hill
- Works to focus on targeted weeds and maintenance of weed growth



Environmental monitoring

• BSC Compliance Audit

- Ballina Shire Council undertook an Environmental Compliance Audit onsite in November.
- No major issues raised by Council.
- Request to supply a separate Annual Environmental Report
- Undertake an audit of Bunding of oils and chemicals onsite

Communications update






• The CCC met on 9 May to discuss the postponement of the Whole of Community meeting due to damage at the quarry after severe flooding at the site.

- Due to continued wet weather in the region for most of the year a new date for the WoC meeting needs to be found for early 2023 July?.
- Kate wrote to Council on two occasions and provided photos of the poor state of roads around the quarry, noting that Boral pays a substantial fee to Council for the upkeep of roads around our site and asked that our neighbours and committee members concerns are given urgent consideration.
