The Stonyfell Quarry is one of Adelaide's oldest quarries, having been in operation since 1837.

The quarry was acquired by Boral when it became the primary shareholder of Quarry Industries Ltd in the 1980s.

The quality of the resource and its proximity to the CBD has helped to shape the Adelaide skyline as we know it.

Our products include road base, aggregates and sands for use in a majority of building Infrastructure and roads that we use everyday.

Mine Operations Plan update

Chasing the fugitive

Our pursuit of best practice where fugitive dust is concerned is continuing in 2021.

The Stonyfell site has many air borne dust management practices that are in practice every day to reduce airborne dust, these include, wetting of roads, crushing plant dust extraction systems, and water spray suppressions systems located strategically on stockpiles and crushing transfer points. The Site also has a vehicle Wheel wash, which cleans the vehicle of all trucks exiting the quarry.

Boral remains committed to being a responsible neighbour and to continuous improvement of our operations in the interests of those that live around us.

Rehabilitation

Boral's commitment to rehabilitation through the planting of indigenous species native to the area is a responsibility that our team take very seriously. example of recent tree plant below.

Water management continuous improvement

We have invested in and installed a silt buster sedimentation unit to the Stonyfell site in 2020. This unit works in conjunction with our sedimentation basin to remove suspended sediment from water in the basin before it is released from site. The results have been very promising.



Through this investment we have significantly improved the quality of the water before it is responsibly discharged off-site

Burning ambition

With the devastating impact of 2019/20 fire season still firmly etched in our memory, Boral's pledge to bushfire preparedness was the highest priority in the leadup to this summer.

Our team at Stonyfell worked hard to get our firebreaks in place before the start of the fire season and we continue to maintain them in readiness.

Boral's commitment at Stonyfell to ZERO Harm will always extend beyond our own gates.
