



BORAL IN MARULAN SOUTH. Continuing a century-old tradition.

Since the 1870s, limestone mined at Marulan South has been used to help build NSW. More than 140 years later, that tradition continues and has grown to include the hard rock aggregates also needed to shape the skyline of our state.

In the coming months, Boral will be implementing plans to continue the important role its Marulan South operations play in the growth and development of NSW. As part of these plans, we'll be seeking your support for the operations which have supported the community for more than a century.

Boral's State Significant Development (SSD) application is being developed for submission to the NSW Department of Planning and Environment so that the 140-year-old Marulan South Limestone operations can continue for another 30 years.

Separate to this, Boral is also putting together an application to change some of the current arrangements at the neighbouring Boral Peppertree Quarry. Peppertree, which opened its gates at the start of 2014, produces the hard rock aggregates needed to make items such as concrete and asphalt.

Although simple changes when compared to the Limestone SSD application, the rapid increase in demand for the new quarry's aggregates means they are needed to ensure Peppertree can keep pace with the available market.

Small changes to make a big difference

Activity occurs on the Peppertree site 24 hours a day, however the 'in pit' operations only take place between 7am and 7pm. Boral is seeking approval for an additional six hours of 'in pit' works to assist with meeting market demand.

As there will be no change in the activities carried out 'in pit', minimal changes are anticipated in respect of external influences on surrounding properties. Given the operations take place inside the quarry pit, the advantages gained in noise reduction and dust controls remain the same.

The approval sought will also include the emplacement of additional overburden along with that from the Marulan South Limestone operations.
