Boral is pleased to present this issue of the Marulan South Operations newsletter.

The long awaited move of the LT160 in pit crusher happened this month. The crusher weighing 285 tonnes was slowly walked down 35 metres onto the first bench of the pit. As the crusher was also towing the two mobile conveyors it was a slow and exacting operation. Prior to its move a number of desk top exercises were held to plan the best approach and to identify any potential for issues. A number of times the move was delayed due to the weather however as of the end of March the crusher made its way to its new location and is in operation without any concerns.



Keeping our people safe is a priority to Boral and we have a detailed safety management system in place. We do, however, acknowledge that just having the right paperwork in place is not all that is needed. To that end the Peppertree quarry has commenced the "Safe Start" program for all its staff. Our Marulan South operations have been running the program for over a year with great enthusiasm. This program is focussed on us as individuals and understanding how we create unsafe situations through our lack of focus or forethought.

How many of us have been bumped into by other people when we are out shopping because they or we are talking or looking else where, while we continue to walk. Only a small example but when we are not focussed or being mindful it's all too easy for things to go wrong.

Battle of the Bulge winners have been announced after 3 months of team effort in weight loss and exercise.


The winners of the Battle of the Bulge Steps Challenge are "The South Marulan Shufflers" with 2,536,960 steps!
