NSW CCAA ENVIRONMENT AWARDS

Congratulations go to our Marulan South Limestone operations who won the Environmental Innovation Award at the NSW CCAA Awards Friday night.

Seeking to reduce the emissions from the rotary kiln, our operators undertook an innovative approach to upgrade the bag filter used to capture dust particles. Using computer modelling, the proposed modifications (which included water cooling of the gas temperature and modification of the air flow) showed a huge reduction in particles collected. The modifications have been implemented with the reduction in particles collected being realised as well as improvements in operation of the bag filter unit itself.

Congratulations also go to our Berrima operations who were awarded the Environmental Best Performance Award for their dust management and rehabilitation program.
