Safety at site

October and November have been big months with a heightened focus on safety.

Both Marulan South sites held Safety interventions to ensure focus on improving safety amongst our teams working onsite. We want to make sure everyone goes home in the condition in which they arrive at work.

Peppertree Quarry's intervention focused on housekeeping. The site's maintenance team and contractors spent the day talking through housekeeping, then spent the afternoon cleaning

designated areas. All collected materials were stockpiled, sending a clear message about what we leave lying around when a job is finished. Different initiatives have now been put in place to further learning from this day.
