New Pathway for Residents

Based on requests from the community, Boral has been working with the City of Gosnells to construct new multi-purpose paths along Reservoir road.

These pathways provide safer places for residents and horses to travel along these roads.

Orange Grove Quarry Plant Upgrade

Boral's Board has approved the relocation and upgrade of the crushing and screening equipment at the Orange Grove Quarry. This multi million-dollar investment by Boral will deliver a plant that has greater efficiency and a significant reduction in noise and dust emissions.

Work is due to commence in November 2015 and will be completed by July 2017.

Following the completion of the plant upgrade, there is a plan to relocate the stockyard from its current position to a site that is more protected from wind disturbances and further away from residential properties (approximately 400 metres east of its current location).

Orange Grove Quarry Wins Industry Award

In addition to the scheduled plant upgrade, Boral has been working to reduce dust emissions on site at Orange Grove. Boral recently installed a new dust suppression system as part of its ongoing efforts to control dust.

This system was recently recognised by Cement Concrete & Aggregates Australia, with an award in the category of Health & Safety Best Performance – Extractive.
