**1. Apologies / Introductions:**

- Tim Slack, Development Manager was introduced to the members

**2. Action Items of last meeting (12 March 08)**

**Quarry Extension Update**

Clayton Hill gave a short update on the progress of the Quarry Extension.

Boral are preparing an Operational Works Application in addition to satisfying pre-commencement conditions including Road Maintenance Contributions, Performance Bonds, Installation of Plant & Equipment measures and Vegetation Clearing.

A site based management plan is already in place that includes:

- weed monitoring
- fire management
- fauna habitat corridors
- erosion and sediment control plan

Boral have submitted an Application with the Department of Main Roads to build a Fauna Underpass within the road reserve on Dayboro Road. It has been proven more difficult than anticipated, hence the delay.

Cllr David Dwyer suggested, once works for the Fauna Underpass has been completed, we should engage media to tell 'good news story'. Cllr Dwyer also reported that Council produces a magazine called "Moreton Bay Living" which is published bi-monthly, which is always interested in good news stories. Clayton to keep Elke informed to organise good news story and media.

### **Petrie Koala Fodder Plantation**

Feedback of Koala carers and Australia Zoo in regards to the quality of the fodder at the Petrie Koala Fodder Plantation, especially in the area that was trialed with ABCT.

This action item has been postponed until the next meeting (26 Nov 08) due to the absence of Wanda Grabowski.

### **3. Current Local Issues**

Cllr David Dwyer mentioned that visitors to the area are interested in viewing kangaroos and wallabies, and asked if Boral would consider integrating plant species such as 'kangaroo grasses into future plantings.

Clayton explained this is part of the Rehabilitation Plan for the Petrie Quarry site including a list of local plant species selected by a Botanist specifically for the Petrie area. Once closer to the planting stage, we may review species list at the meeting to accommodate kangaroos and wallabies as well a koalas and other local native fauna.

Cllr Dwyer reported that he regularly receives community complaints about trucks using exhaust brakes/airbrakes while travelling through Petrie. In addition, trucks park in the local areas eg. Adsett's Road, during waiting periods, often early in the mornings and their breaks and motors wake local residents.

Andy Stuart said he had been checking on trucks and spoken to drivers - they have been warned. However, they are often LOD's or other trucks rather than Boral trucks. Clayton Hill said he had been visiting locals to watch and listen with them at their own home for illegal break use.

Andy and Clayton re-iterated complaints require a description of the truck eg.

- registration
- colour of truck
- any specific markings, stickers, anything to identify the vehicle
- size of truck (eg. truck & dog)
- date and time of offence

and immediate calls to the quarry or Clayton Hill direct have the best chance for followed up and to identify offenders. In the meantime, management will keep an eye on trucks in the area.

Cllr Dwyer also queried the old load limit sign for the Boundary Road bridge. The newly built bridge has no load limit, hence the councillor suggested the limit should be reviewed and possibly lifted. Clayton to check with Transport.

**5. Any other business**

- The latest issue (Issue 10) Boral 'Changing Perceptions' newsletter was distributed to the members.
- Elke mentioned frequency of meetings in 2009 could be reduced from 4 to 3 meetings annually. Unplanned meetings could be called if there were issues to be resolved before the next planned meeting. The frequency of meetings for 2009 is an agenda item for next meeting (19 November 2008).
