1. Introduction

- Clayton Hill introduced Molly Robson from Three Plus. Molly is employed by Boral as a consultant to help in the Development Approval process for the Petrie Quarry extension.
- Bruce Barry, Area Manager South East Queensland Quarries, was introduced as a new member to the group.

2. Action Items

Wanda Grabowski and Elke Stapf were discussing the need of low intensity back-burning around the Petrie Quarry to minimise chances of koalas being hurt in case of a bushfire. It was recommended to have a meeting on site to review and discuss the proposed back-burning areas and bush fire management plan. Wayne Hardy, SEQ Water, offered to send contact details of their Land Management Officer to Elke for further assistance on the matter. Ian Baldwin and Elke Stapf will follow up and arrange a meeting.

3. Current Operational Issues, Petrie Quarry

Paul West gave an overview of the Quarry Extension Proposal and emphasised Boral's intention of a transparent process. Boral is required to follow the statutory development approval process - the community, State and Local Government, Environmental Protection Agency, Main Roads, etc will be encouraged to provide input into the proposal. .Paul named the consultants employed by Boral to assist in the planning process. A "shop front" will provide an opportunity for everyone to view and receive further information regarding the proposed extension. The shop front will be held on Saturday 13 May (invitations will be sent out closer to the date).

Molly Robson introduced herself and Three Plus. Three Plus has been employed to assist Boral with Community and Stakeholder Engagement. Molly was the former Environmental Minister of Queensland and is now the Principal Consultant of Three Plus, Molly has worked on three other quarries projects and her experience will be an advantage to all stakeholders.

Molly's proposed process:

- Boral will have a shop front: announcing the proposed extension, explaining every aspect of the project incl. posters/aerials etc:
 - shop front will be advertised in local newspapers;
 - mail box drops will occur;
 - newsletters will be sent out; and
 - feedback at community liaison group meetings.
- the planning process will be explained through the shop front
- there will be team members present to answer questions
- feedback forms
- contact details such as an 1800 number and an e-mail address

Cr Graeme Ashworth commended Boral on their commitment to discuss issues with stakeholders before lodgement and hence envisages it to be a better development application.

Graham Dunlop requested information on the separation area for the Whiteside Key Resource Area under the Draft State Planning Policy for the Protection of Extractive Resources and asked why certain rural residential properties had been excluded and others not. Clayton Hill advised that the Department of Natural Resources Mines and Water decided on the extent of the separation areas and they would be the best to contact for further information and clarification.

4. Local Issues

Clayton Hill announced a Recreational Trial Bike Project which is proposed for the Petrie area. Cr Graeme Ashworth believes it is still open for discussion and no applications have been made as yet. He also mentioned that the project may be moved to Kilcoy.

5. General Issues

Elke Stapf raised the question of changing the meeting day from Wednesdays to Thursdays. The majority of members voted to continue with Wednesdays.
