Meeting started: 5.15pm

1. **Apologies:** see above

2. Action Items

- Low Intensity Back-burning: Glenn Bell from the Rural Fire Brigade will arrange an initial meeting to look at existing fire breaks and identify what is required once resources are available. Once requirements are established other stakeholders will be called for their expert advice. Wanda Grabowski mentioned she won't be available on Thursdays.

Cr David Dwyer mentioned the Samford Rural Fire Brigade could also be of assistance.

Ian Baldwin will prepare a draft fire management plan in the mean time.

- The Shop Front was successfully held on Saturday 13 May from 11.00am to 2.00pm at the Park Rotunda within the North Pine Country Park, Dayboro Road, Kurwongbah, Petrie.
- Details for contact person within the Department of Natural Resources and Mines were passed on from Clayton Hill to Greg Dunlop.

3. Quarry Extension Proposal

Paul West provided feedback on the Shopfront, held on Saturday 13 May. The arrangements for the shopfront were communicated through

- members of the community liaison group / koala fodder plantation committee
- members listed on our blasting schedule
- mail outs to the community
- advertised in the local paper

A relatively small number of people attended the Shopfront and one feedback form was completed. There is a process in place to answer questions asked on the feedback forms.

Greg Dunlop mentioned that local papers do not reach all residents in the area. Mail drops would possibly have more impact.

Cr David Dwyer explained - as a general rule - community will stand up and protest only if new haul routes and increased trucking traffic is proposed on their door step.

Clayton Hill reported that 'draft reports' are coming in from our consultants for the DA process. Greg Dunlop asked for a review of these reports when available. Paul West confirmed that although a second shop front will be held during the public notification stage of the DA process (later in the year, or early next year) to fully inform stakeholders of the detail of the reports, the liaison group would be briefed as soon as reports are finalised.

4. Local Issues

Greg Dunlop highlighted the increase on traffic and burn-outs on Adsett Road. Steve Wighton (looking after the dam for the Pine Rivers Fish Management Association) has installed a surveillance camera at the gate leading to the dam off Adsett Road.

Cr David Dwyer informed the members on the "Pine Rivers Crime Stoppers" and their projects eg. non-reversible screws on number plates to stop the theft of the plates. David mentioned such institutions rely on sponsorships and suggested Boral become involved.
