<p>BLASTING</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> TW ran through blasting monitoring results highlighting that we are well below our (Boral) required limit in most cases <ul style="list-style-type: none"> TW would briefly described the drill and blasting process SAPOL should have been notified that the blast monitors were stolen (Rodney confirmed that they were not notified) Recent Blasting Results: Ken- the 3.34mm/sec blast really rattled the house and could be heard rattling near by houses as the vibration moved away (People as far away as Barramundi drive felt the blast) Do we need to get a Geologist to explain details of Linwood area The blasting is now at a point where Orica is achieving their target consistently, but we still need to do some work as the vibration is still really felt by the neighbours <p>DUST MONITORING</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> TW ran through dust monitoring results highlighting that we are well below our (Boral) required limit in most cases <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Some of the residents believe that the majority of dust impacting the residential houses is generated at night Only Boral trucks tarp up, what about other trucks?? TW- we can't control other truck drivers easily, it is not a legislative requirement yet, and a lot of the truck drivers get away from it because their loads are wet from the Pugmill.

<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Storm water enters our site Current method of using the storm water in Linwood is working well Can we use this water to wet down the stockpiles and overburden New truck wash is working well, with the sprinklers soon to be operating effectively (EPA happy with the progress)

Where do we put all the O/B? We may have to blast south to a degree to provide a location to put the O/B • We plan to move 2 benches lower in the bottom pit • Potentially have an entrance road coming in from the east in the future (no time line) • TW stated that the quarry would be open for 70 years not 10-12 years
