## 1. Action Items of last meeting ( 19 November 08)

### Update on Quarry Extension Implementation

#### Fauna Underpass

Tim Slack spoke about the Application for the Fauna Underpass, which has been approved by Department of Main Roads. Tim presented a plan showing the proposed fauna fencing and underpass. Contractors to start work soon.

#### Update on Quarry Extension Implementation

Pre-start conditions have been satisfied, and work will shortly commence within the approved extension area. Quarrying operations on remainder of site will remain the same.

Clayton Hill explained the quarry extension is to progress in stages. A map was presented to show the area and stages over the next 5 years.

Steven Wighton asked how much material was required to be removed before we got to good quality rock - Clayton advised 2-3 benches of overburden or lower class material would need to be removed first, equalling 15-20m in depth. Clayton invited Steven to visit site anytime.

## 2. Current Local Issues

### a) Council:

- Noise from exhaust breaks was raised
- Cr Dwyer spoke about trucks parking illegally and disturbing residents (may not always be Boral trucks)
- Cr Dwyer asked if new airport runway contract material would be coming from Petrie Quarry. Clayton advised that our Narangba material would be of a suitable quality but we had not been approached as yet to his knowledge.
- Cr Dwyer asked how many trucks are coming out of Petrie. Clayton advised that it depends on market fluctuation and the jobs being supplied which can vary on a daily basis.

### b) Boral Supporting the Local Community:

#### Fishing day at Petrie Quarry

Michael Long spoke about a recent fishing day held at the Petrie Quarry dam on Boral buffer land. Photos of the day were shown.

#### ***History of the community project:***

Pine Rivers Fish Management Association (PRFMA) and Boral commenced a fish-breeding program in 2003. The venture was to breed Saratoga fish in one of the Petrie Quarry dams; eleven breeding fish were first introduced. Once breeding was confirmed the Saratoga were to be caught and transferred to Lake Samsonvale for future breeding and recreational fishing purposes.

On 15 March 2009 PRFMA members along with Boral quarry staff enjoyed a social fishing day to prove the success of the program. Eight juvenile Saratoga were caught, transferred from the Petrie Quarry dam and released into Lake Samsonvale. All agreed the fishing day was a success and this project is further evidence that the quarry industry and the environment can develop in harmony with the commitment of all parties.

## Caboolture District Swimming Trials

Clayton Hill spoke about the Caboolture District swimming trials held on Wednesday, 19th March 2009, at the Caboolture Aquatic Centre. Boral supported the Burpengary Meadows State School in providing students with free entry. As a result of these trials, Caboolture District was able to select an ultra competitive Swim team for the upcoming Sunshine Coast Regional Trials.

The event was a great success with up to 100 swimmers competing for a place on the Caboolture District Team. Kris Kearney, PE Teacher, Burpengary Meadows State School said, "on behalf of Caboolture District Sports committee, I would like to thank Boral for their involvement and look forward to future dealings with them."

- Cr Dwyer spoke about a scheme reducing mozzies through placing fingerlings in waterways in the local area. Cr Dwyer asked if Boral would be interested in allowing fingerlings to be introduced into dams on the quarry. Cr Dwyer also spoke about a local initiative in conjunction with Pine Rivers Fish Management to teach fishing to disabled children.

Clayton asked Cr Dwyer to send a written request to Boral on both of these matters.
