1. Action Items of last meeting (25 November 2009)

Update on Quarry Extension Implementation

Pre-start conditions have been satisfied and work has commenced within the approved extension area. Quarrying operations on remainder of site will stay the same.

Luke Holley explained that extensive weed management across the site has to be carried out. A key component of this is a controlled back-burn. Discussions have been held between Boral and the Rural Fire Brigade about conducting a burn during the winter months. Once the burn is completed, landscape rehabilitation works will commence in the buffer lands. Luke advised that a dozer would be on site soon to cut more fire breaks and make tracks back towards the pit. The Rural Fire Brigade are also offering advice on the positioning of the breaks.

Luke presented a map for the controlled burn and also a map of the landscape rehabilitation plan for the site.

As per the action item from the last meeting, Tim Slack will present a plan/perspective map displaying the stages and views from the south-east corner of the quarry during the next meeting.

2. Current Local Issues

a) Council:

- Cr Dwyer spoke about a recent meeting with a local Scouts group. The Scouts are concerned about the fuel loads in the area this season and the risk of bushfires. Cr Dwyer asked if Boral would be willing to supply a water truck to assist in any fire management in the area. Andy Stuart advised that the water truck at the Boral quarry is not registered for road use. However, the nearby Holcim Quarry may have a road registered water truck that could be used. Luke Holley advised that if the Scouts are concerned about the risk of bushfires in the area, they should discuss this with the Rural Fire Brigade.

b) Operational Issues:

- Andy Stuart advised that the quarry is still conscious of start times and adhering to licence conditions.

3. Any other Business

- Steven Wighton raised concerns about truck drivers littering the rest area on Adsetts Road. Steven advised that he didn't record truck details, but noted it was a yellow truck responsible. The group was advised to record registration details if possible to accurately identify trucks responsible for littering incidents.
