### Introductions

Elke introduced:

- **Christian Lewis** – Manager Petrie Quarry. Christian comes with a wealth of experience in the quarry industry and is looking forward to being a part of the Boral quarry team. Michael Long has accepted an internal role of Project Manager (Quarries).
- **Andrew Lyndon**, Planning & Development Manager. Andrew has joined the Boral Property Group in February 2014. He is a qualified Town Planner & Environmental Scientist. Andrew is responsible for managing development applications, implementation of development approvals, and due diligence activities for the quarry business.

- **Action Items of last meeting (9 October 2014)**

**Update on progress of rehabilitation work on site**

Jessica van Soest provided an update on the rehabilitation project:

Since the last meeting in October 2013 we have undertaken our final quarterly rehabilitation review for the project. Future reviews will be undertaken as required. By mid November the rehabilitation works were almost complete for stage one. Works in the last few months has included maintenance of seedlings and weeding.

Jess presented photos of habitat revegetation areas showing the growth of seedlings planted and natural regeneration on the buffer management areas. Seedling have done really well in most areas with some seedlings reaching over two meters, where some seedlings have struggled more in the recently planted area near the stockpile yard, as they have been planted while it has been very dry and soil quality is less than optimal.

Jess presented a map showing areas where moderate amounts of maintenance are required. All other areas will require ongoing minor maintenance of seedlings and weed removal.

Future works include weeding existing areas, seedling maintenance, maintenance including slashing of both new and old koala fodder plantations. NatureCall have been engaged to undertake these interim works.

- **Current Local Issues**

Cr Dwyer reported community complaints from residents living alongside Dayboro Road, reporting trucks parking in front of their houses while waiting for the quarry to open. Terry Scott to follow up.

Cr Dwyer provided a heads up to liaison group members on a large local project (Thiess) that will require trucks carting from Dohles Rocks Road to Anzac Avenue, approximately 84 trucks a day, where only one truck will be able to go through the green lights.

Steven Wighton said the Pine Rivers Fish Management Association would be planning a fishing day at the Boral's site dams in the near future. Watch this space.

- **Current Operational Issues**

- Greg Dunlop asked about future fuel reduction burns on the quarry site. Christian Lewis advised there are no fuel reduction burns planned at this stage, however fire tracks on site have been updated for the upcoming fire season - June to September.

- Greg also asked about future quarry expansions. Christian advised that further expansion of the quarry pit is planned for middle of next year. The quarry is running approximately 40% capacity at the moment.
