Introductions

Clare Anderson introduced Michael Higgins to the liaison group members. Michael replaced Christian Lewis as the Quarry Manager for Petrie. Christian transferred to Moy Pocket Quarry. Michael has been with Boral for over 3 years, before commencing at Petrie Michael was in charge of Purga Quarry.

- **Action Items of last meeting (9 October 2014)**

Immediate Works Area

Jessica van Soest spoke on behalf of Andrew Lyndon to update the group on the Immediate works area. Jessica provided the group with an aerial map to indicate where the Immediate work would be taking place.

Planned Pit Development Works

Jessica advised that at the time of the meeting vegetation clearing was planned for a small part of the approved quarry footprint within the next few months. The clearing would facilitate access to further hard rock resources. Jessica informed the group that Sediment Erosion Controls would be implemented and a Fauna Spotter Catcher would observe all clearing works. Jessica added that all relevant approvals were in place at the time of the meeting meaning all clearing activity could go ahead.

Update on progress of rehabilitation work on site

Jessica van Soest provided an update on the rehabilitation project. Jess advised that since the two previous liaison meetings in March 2014 and Oct 2015 there has been a team of two visiting once per month to work on the rehabilitation works. The rehabilitation team had been focusing on weeding the lantana in the koala fodder plantation. In other areas of the site target had been to weed lantana, snake weed, wild tobacco, groundsel and guava.

Jessica advised that there had been fauna sightings including: swamp wallaby, black kite, pheasant, eastern grey kangaroo, goanna brown snake, yellow tailed black cockatoo and kookaburras.

At the time of the meeting Jessica advised that 500 seedlings had been planted bringing total to over 15,000 seedlings since 2011.
